

Much of the funding available through the Department of Energy is distributed through competitive solicitations. DOE and its national laboratories conduct competitive procurements through a number of offices.





Central Contractor Registration

- Contractors must be registered with the Central Contractor Registration (CCR) database
<http://www.ccr.gov/index.cfm>
- This database serves as a single collection point for vendor registration for:
 - EFT data
 - Acquisition information
 - Integrated registration and point of contact information
- Eliminates the collection of the SF-129 and the Solicitation Mailing List Application Form

An Applicant has to register only once in IIPS. This registration is permanent and is used for all IIPS submissions. Therefore, if an Applicant has already registered, do not register again. For those Applicants that have not previously registered:

- Go to the IIPS website at <http://ie-center.doe.gov>
- Click on the "Register" button.
- Click on the box that says, "Check this box for Acquisitions greater than Simplified Acquisition threshold or financial assistance" and then click on the button next to the "Register" only – This allows you to submit proposals.
- Click on "Proceed to Forms."
- Read the "Notice of Disclaimer" and click on "I Accept" if you are in agreement.
